The college has a Management Information System. The Admission process, fees collection, and students' data are mostly recorded through the computerized system.

6.3. Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1. Curriculum Development:

The college is affiliated to Dibrugarh University and as such curriculum in the semester system is developed by the University. The University engages teachers of the College in Curriculum Development Committees.

6.3.2. Examination and Evaluation:

University examinations (End semester examinations) are conducted as per rules and guidelines provided by The Dibrugarh University (the affiliating university). The evaluation is carried out by teachers as per direction of the University. The college is identified by the university as one of the examination evaluation Zones and as such teachers are engaged in the evaluation process. Two In-Semester sessional examinations are conducted by the College. Internal assessment marks are awarded to the students based on their performance in their sessional examinations / group discussion / seminar and viva voce.

6.3.3. Teaching and Learning:

Efforts are being made to make the teaching and learning process more learner-centric. An academic calendar is prepared at the beginning of each year along with teaching plans. Efforts are being made to approach syllabi on the basis of the plan. Students are continuously evaluated through Class Tests, In-Semester Examinations, Viva, Projects works etc. Students participate in seminar, group discussion and/or class assignment to garner points in internal assessment. Slow learners are motivated to join remedial and tutorials classes

6.3.4. Research and Development:

The College has Biotechnological Research Center (Institutional Level Biotechnology Hub). One faculty member of the Department of Zoology is a Ph.D. supervisor under Dibrugarh University.

6.3.5. Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation:

- Library: The College Library is equipped with internet services viz. INFLIBNET, NLIST and SOUL 2. Bar coding, Digitization of records of Books and computerized book lending facilities are there.
- ICT: Internet facility through Wi-Fi system is available in all Departments, Library and Office of the College.

➤ Physical Infrastructure/Instrumentation: The College has the heritage building and rooms that houses the Science Departments with Practical laboratories. There are boys' and girls' hostels. During this period, classrooms, Laboratories, students' common room were renovated and new furniture provided. Repairing and renovation works of the College Boys' hostels, staff quarters, auditorium, NCC building and the College Canteen were undertaken.

- Providing training programmes to staff.
- Providing better infrastructure for teachers, staffs, students.
- Encouraging faculty to pursue academic courses, research works.
