Internal assessment marks are awarded to the students on the basis of their performances in the sessional examinations, group discussion/seminars.

6.3.3. Teaching and Learning:

Efforts are being made to make the teaching and learning process more learner-centric.

Academic calendar has prepared at the start of the academic year along with teaching plan.

Sophisticated teaching and Learning methods have been adopted.

Stimulating teaching techniques like Smart Class Rooms have been introduced.

6.3.4. Research and Development:

For Research and Development funding can be sought from different agencies like UGC, DST, ICSSR and the faculties are encouraged to undertake Research Projects.

Students of some departments undertake various Field Studies and Project Works as partial fulfillment of their programme.

College has an Institutional Level Biotechnology Hub.

One faculty member of the Department of Zoology is research guide of Dibrugarh University.

6.3.5. Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation:

(i) Library:

- (a) The college library is equipped with Internet services viz. N-LIST INFLIBNET and SOUL operating system.
- (b) The library has a number of 40,195 books, 3 National News Papers, 3 Journals and 12 periodical Magazines.

- (b) The college has 1 spacious Auditorium and 2 Conference halls.
