The college is affiliated to Dibrugarh University and as such curriculum is developed by the University. The University involves teachers of the College in Curriculum Development as members. One faculty of the college a member of University Board of Studies and one is a member of the University Academic Council.

6.3.2. Examination and Evaluation:

Both B.A, B. Sc. And M.A. programmes are Semester basis.
The End semester examinations are conducted as per rules of Dibrugarh University.
Two In-semester sessional examinations are conducted by the college.
Internal assessment marks are awarded to the students on the basis of their performances in the sessional examinations, group discussion/seminars.

Efforts are being made to make the teaching and learning process more learner-centric.
Academic calendar has prepared at the start of the academic year along with teaching plan.
Sophisticated teaching and Learning methods have been adopted.
Stimulating teaching techniques like Smart Class Rooms have been introduced.
